UNIFORM

The junior uniform is to be worn by Years 7-9 students, and senior uniform by Years 10-12. The correct College summer or winter uniform should be worn at all times when travelling to or from school, around the campus and at any College function, including after school hours. General Expectations

As a St Leo's student, you are an ambassador for the College at all times, but especially when wearing the College uniform. The uniform enhances our sense of belonging to the College community. Wearing your uniform correctly shows pride in your appearance and enhances the reputation of the College in the wider community.

As part of enrolment at the College, students and parents/carers agree on the importance of uniform and grooming standards, wearing the school uniform correctly and with pride. It is at the discretion of the College as to acceptable uniform and grooming standards for students. Modifications may be required on an individual basis.

The College will contact parents and put in place appropriate consequences for students who continuously break uniform and grooming guidelines. Students who do not meet the uniform or grooming expectations will be subject to the following:

- **First and second occasions:** Infringement on Compass
- **Third occasion:** Restorative growth intervention
- **Fourth occasion:** Student will be required to leave campus and rectify the problem before returning.

This resets each Term.

What to do if you are out of Uniform – Uniform Passes

If you are not in correct uniform for an acceptable reason, you must obtain a Uniform Pass from your Year Leader or Student Services before Mentor Class. You should present a Compass or written note from your parent/carer along with this diary to your Year Leader before Mentor Class to be issued with a **Uniform Pass** for the day.

Trousers/ Shorts Dress/ Shirt/ Slacks	• College navy blue trousers or navy shorts in summer with navy ankle-length crew socks. Both must be worn belted at the waist with a conservative plain black leather belt. OR • Senior - College navy striped skirt, navy slacks or navy shorts, or • Junior - Striped purple and white short sleeved dress, navy slacks or shorts. • All dresses/skirts must be worn no shorter than just above the knee.
Shirt/ Blouse (crested)	• Senior - white College shirt, or blouse. • Junior - purple striped College shirt. • Shirts must be ironed, fully buttoned and tucked into trousers/shorts at all times. • Fitted shirts may be worn out.
Jumper/ Pullover Scarf & Gloves	• Navy with College neck stripe. Must be well fitted. • Optional navy College or plain navy scarf and/ or plain navy fitted gloves.
Blazer (crested)	• Compulsory outer garment in winter when travelling to and from school. • Compulsory at formal College events or when representing the College.
Tie	• Senior - College striped navy tie with crest, worn all year, or • Junior - College plain navy tie with crest, worn all year
Shoes	• Black, fully enclosed, polished leather shoes. • Open, ballet-style, soft canvas or fashion shoes do not meet safety standards.
Socks	• Plain navy ankle-length crew socks with both trousers and shorts, or • White ankle-length College socks with purple stripe with dress/tunic or skirt in summer, or • Navy tights in winter, or plain navy ankle-length crew socks with slacks or shorts.
Sports Cap/ Bucket Hat	• College sports cap or bucket hat to be worn on campus. It is mandatory for students to wear the College sports cap or hat when involved in outdoor sport or PDHPE activities.

Junior Summer Uniform

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Sports Uniform

The College sports uniform is to be worn to and from the College on designated sports or PDHPE prac days only, or for excursions or other events as advised. If full sports uniform is not available on this day, you should present a Compass or written note from your parent/carer explaining reasons. Combinations of sports and normal school uniform are not permitted and will be considered out of uniform.

Tracksuit	The new style College tracksuit should be worn in winter and the jacket worn on cooler sports days throughout the year.
Shirts & shorts	Students should wear the crested College sports or House polo shirt and shorts.
Shoes & socks	Sports shoes/runners/cross trainers with plain white ankle-length crew socks. Soft canvas slip-on or lace-up fashion shoes (e.g. Vans) are not appropriate for school or sport.
Rep. team uniforms	Students in representative sports will be required to wear the appropriate uniform for that team, which may require purchase of alternate clothing e.g. football shorts, socks, netball dress.
Sports Equipment	Some sports may require equipment supplied by students e.g. towels (for the gym). If this cannot be organised, alternate sport selections should be made.



Uniform & Grooming Expectations

Bags	• The St Leo's College backpack is compulsory for all Year 7-12 students and the only school bag approved for use. Sports bags and other non-St Leo's bags are not permitted. • The College backpack should be clearly labelled with the student's name and kept in a reasonable condition, clean of graffiti, stickers etc.	Bags	• School bags must be left in lockers during the day. Lockers and bags may be accessed at recess/lunch. Students may choose to carry laptops, pens, books etc. in a plain black or dark blue satchel or carry bag between classes. • A College excursion/library/swim bag is also available for those purposes
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Grooming

Grooming and personal presentation is an important part of wearing the uniform with pride. Below are the College's expectations regarding personal grooming:

Hair	• Hair must be well groomed and maintained at all times – clean and neatly brushed/combed. • Any hair colouring is to appear natural. Patches or stripes of colour are not acceptable. • Undercut styles, steps, stripes or other patterns (e.g. mullets) shaved into hair styles or of exaggerated lengths that are not blended or have an obvious undercut are not acceptable. • A minimal amount of 'product' may be used to conservatively style hair. • 'Number 2' is the minimum acceptable length and must be all one length. • If hair falls beyond the collar line, it must be neatly tied back in a single style. • Fringes must be at a length so hair does not cover the student's eyes. • 'Extreme' haircuts are not acceptable e.g. mullets, rat's tails or mohawks.
Jewellery	• A simple chain with cross, other religious symbol or medical information may be worn under the shirt. • One small stud or sleeper may be worn in each ear lobe. • Nose jewellery, rings, anklets and bracelets (unless for medical purposes) are not allowed. • Any other excessive jewellery including rings and 'clears' are not acceptable.
Piercings & Tattoos	• Both piercings and tattoos are discouraged and the following expectations apply at the College and at all College events: • Visible jewellery or piercings including nose studs/rings are not permitted. • Tattoos must be covered at all times.
Facial Hair	• Students are to be clean-shaven at all times. • The College will provide equipment for those students who do not meet this expectation.
Make-up	• Students should not wear eye make-up, lipstick or nail polish - subtle tinted moisturiser is permitted. • Artificial or shellac nails, French manicures, false eyelashes/extensions, etc. are also not permitted. Students will be asked to have the polish/artificial nails/lashes removed as soon as possible if worn to the College.
