Uniforms

- **New uniforms** should be ordered directly through **Midford** (Turramurra store) by **mid December** for guaranteed delivery by the start of school year. (Note we do not have an onsite uniform shop, however Midford do deliver to Leo's for free on school days)
- **2 x sport polos** are required – 1 x House + 1 x general sport. When ordering, Houses will not yet be allocated. We will send list to supplier to allocate to the correct House once finalised.

- Opens in Term 4 - Order before the end of year (suggest ASAP)

Stationery

- Stationery packs will be supplied for each student on Day 1
- A keyed padlock for lockers will be supplied with stationery packs
- We suggest picking up students on Day 1 if possible as the packs are quite heavy for students to carry home

ST LEO'S SWIMMING CARNIVAL

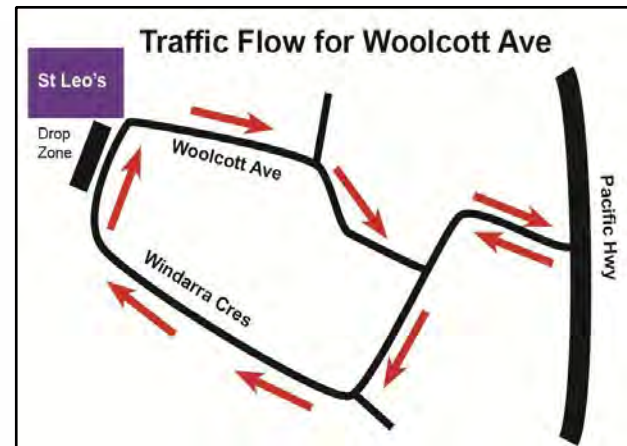
